



Guadalupe County Governor Greg Abbott's newest plan to Operate

Guadalupe County is evaluating Governor Greg Abbott's newest plan to open Texas.

On Wednesday afternoon, the Governor announced that county officials may begin working with the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission to allow bars to operate with in-person service.

Governor Abbot also announced that effective October 14, 2020, bars in counties that opt-in will be able to resume in-person services at 50% capacity. However, all customers must be seated while eating and drinking.

Guadalupe County Judge Kyle Kutscher has been working with the Guadalupe County Emergency Management Office since the announcement on a plan to resume in-person services at 50% capacity. The County will be scheduling meetings with local Mayors, TABC, and local law enforcement to consider opting-in and enforcing Governor Abbot's new order. A decision on opting in to the Governor's newest plan will be made by October 13, 2020.
