City of Schertz to Host Second COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic

SCHERTZ, Texas – The City of Schertz and Guadalupe County are partnering together to host a series of COVID-19 vaccine clinics this week. The Texas Department of State Health Services has allocated 1,000 Moderna vaccine doses to our community.

COVID-19 vaccines will be administered free of charge at the Schertz Civic Center, located at 1400 Schertz Parkway, Bldg. 5 in Schertz, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, February 4.

The COVID-19 vaccines will be distributed to individuals, per State guidelines, who fall under phases 1A and 1B. These are the only populations currently eligible to be vaccinated at this time.

Phase 1A recipients include:

- Front-line hospital workers
- Long-term care staff (including custodial and food service staff)
- Emergency response personnel
- Home health workers
- Residents of long-term care facilities

Phase 1B recipients include:

- People 65 years of age and older
- People 18 years and older with at least one chronic medical condition that puts them at increased risk for severe illness from the virus that causes COVID-19, including but not limited to:
 - Cancer
 - Chronic kidney disease
 - COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease)
 - Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease or cardiomyopathies
 - Solid organ transplantation
 - Obesity and severe obesity (body mass index of 30 kg/m² or higher)
 - Pregnancy
 - Sickle cell disease
 - Type 2 diabetes mellitus

Patients who are allergic to a component of the vaccine, had any vaccine in the past 14 days, or had a monoclonal infusion the past 90 days are ineligible for the vaccine.

How to Register for an Appointment

Appointments are required and can be made by registering online at [Schertz.com/covidvaccine](https://www.schertz.com/covidvaccine) or by calling the City of Schertz COVID-19 Vaccine Hotline at (210) 619-1990.

Registration will open at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, February 2. Walk-ins will not be accepted. Those with appointments are required to bring a driver's license or other form of photo identification with them to the clinic.

If you are unable get an appointment at the vaccine clinic at the Schertz Civic Center, you can also try securing an appointment at another area vaccine clinic happening this week. The City of Seguin and the Guadalupe Regional Medical Center are conducting COVID-19 vaccine clinics from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, February 3, Thursday, February 4, and Friday, February 5 for 1A and 1B recipients at the Seguin Coliseum located at 950 S. Austin Street in Seguin. To register for this location, visit Seguintexas.gov/covidvaccine or call the Guadalupe County COVID-19 Vaccine Call Center at (830) 303-9701.
